



CDS Dispensing Healthcare Practitioner **Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)** **Data Reporting Requirements**

Who is required to report data to the PDMP?

- Healthcare practitioners or entities who dispense controlled dangerous substances (CDS) prescriptions.
- Certain dispensing activities are exempted from the reporting requirement. Visit the Dispenser Reporting page on www.MarylandPDMP.org for more information and to complete an exemption attestation form if applicable.

What do I have to report?

- Dispensers must electronically report to the Maryland PDMP all Schedule II – V CDS prescriptions dispensed in Maryland. This requirement has been in place since 2013.

What are the new requirements?

- As of October 2018, all non-exempt CDS prescription dispensers **must report dispenses daily** to the Maryland PDMP.
- If no CDS dispenses occur on a given day, a **zero report** is required to be submitted. A separate zero report must be submitted as well for each day the dispenser is closed. Blank dispensing reports are not an acceptable alternative in either case.

How do I report data?

- Dispensing healthcare practitioners must register with and report dispenses to **RxGov**, the State's authorized platform for PDMP data collection.
